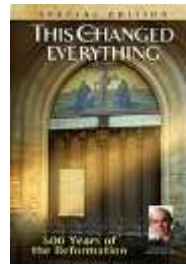


On Sunday, October 29<sup>th</sup>, long time members of our church will be honored during worship. Coffee Hour will follow worship.
