For September, Jenny is preaching on 9/6 and 9/27 and I am preaching on 9/13 and 9/20. Communion will be celebrated on 9/6. There is a good bit of uncertainty about many things as we face the fall. All schools are dealing with great challenges to have classes with safety for all. The November election drama has already started. A number of people are very anxious about all sorts of things.

Those who are very keen on discerning the times for the second coming of Christ, see the world-wide pandemic with all its confusion as a sign that the Return is near. Some have claimed to have dreams that foretell a time of great conflict and unrest in the months ahead. People are being told to load up on supplies, guns and ammo. Fear and anxiety can cause people to do strange things!

The time that Jesus lived was a time of great unrest in Palestine with the Roman occupation. Some Jews were revolutionaries (Zealots). Others, like the Sadducees and tax collectors, cooperated with the Romans. Pharisees tried to separate themselves from it all by trying to be super religious. The conflict came to a head with the destruction of Jerusalem and the temple a few years after the death of Jesus.

Jesus, anticipating the challenges his followers would have to face, gave them these words on his last night with them:

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled neither let them be afraid. ..I will go away and I will come to you." (John 14: 27-28)

This has been a very real promise to all believers down through the ages, especially during times of uncertainty!


