On Thursday, November 17<sup>th</sup>, I asked our administrative secretary to send out a statement about some of the new worship practices that I thought would be a wise thing to implement given the new state mandates earlier in the week and given the increasing infection rates throughout the state and nation. Later that afternoon, I participated in a Presbytery sponsored meeting led by three experts in the fields of vaccine research and immunology. Two of these people were from churches in our Presbytery. For several years, I have known Dr. Bill Bartlett from the First Presbyterian Church of Easton, who was one of the presenters. Their information was very instructive and relevant.

What I took away from that meeting, which had many church leaders participating from several presbyteries, was that the best way to stop the spread of this airborne virus was by erecting defensive barriers. Our physical bodies are equipped with some natural barriers which help keep us healthy on a daily basis. Facial masks are just one type of external barrier. Distance between people is another barrier to reduce the virus germs coming toward us. Ventilation is also important, which is why being outside is so much better than being inside. The size of the room, the height of the ceilings, as well as the type of ventilating system in the room all make a difference in terms of virus spread. Another barrier is the length of time we are exposed to the virus particles. They also mentioned that surface sanitizing is less important than previously thought because the virus germs cannot live very long on hard surfaces.

As we all know, the rate of infection has been increasing for some weeks now and is projected to get much worse as we go through the holidays. I believe our area was spared from much virus infection in the spring and summer but now I am aware of more friends and family who are getting the virus. Some area churches who had opened up their buildings and worship services in the past few weeks are now closing up again because they are experiencing infection spread in their congregations.

The windows will be open on the parking lot side so those who are not able to be outside can hear and join in the singing from inside the building. A cup of hot chocolate will be available as we move into the building and finish the service with some readings, candle lighting and ending with the singing of Silent Night. It will be a night to remember with joy!


