On December 13th, George Shultz, former Secretary of State under Presidents Nixon and Reagan, turned 100 years old. He wrote an article which appeared in the 12/20/20 Express Times entitled, *Lessons I've Learned in My 100 Years*. What follows are some of the lessons he shared in the article.

"I'm struck that there is one lesson I learned early and then relearned over and over: Trust is the coin of the realm. When trust was in the room, whatever room it was—the family room, the school room, the locker room, the office room, the government room, or the military room—good things happened. When trust was not in the room, good things did not happen. Everything else is details."

Shultz goes on to describe nine examples of how the presence of trust made a difference in his experience and then concluded with this last one:

Trusting One Another. "In God We Trust." "Yes and when we are at our best, we also trust in each other. Trust is fundamental. Reciprocal and ideally, pervasive. If it is present, anything is possible. If it is absent, nothing is possible. The best leaders trust their followers with the truth, and you know what happens as a result? Their followers trust them back. With that bond, they can do big hard things together, changing the world for the better."

Good insights from a great leader of the past!

Of course not everyone is worthy of such trust. But as much as it depends on each of us, we can determine to be trustworthy. That would be a most helpful New Year's resolution in these times when conspiracy theories abound giving rise to a lack of trust in the very institutions that our democracy is built upon.






