Although we certainly live in a season of divisive politics and serious divisions in our society, we are not unique in having to find our way through troublesome times. A brief look back a few decades shows other believers in Christ have had to face uncertainty and make difficult decisions. One name comes to mind, in part because of his famous serenity prayer.

Reinhold Niebuhr (1892-1971), was a Reformed pastor in Detroit for a number of years before he took a teaching post at the Union Theological Seminary in NYC. He spoke out against the unfair labor practices in the automotive industry. He lived through the rise of communism and the Nazis in Germany. He became a pacifist after seeing the horrors of WW1 but changed his position when Hitler came to power. His writings were very influential as he continued to teach and write into the cold war and Vietnam. His controversial book, 'Moral Man and Immoral Society' seemed to predict the rise of Hitler.

For most of us today, he is known for his serenity prayer. The prayer is often said at 12 -step gatherings and it is a good tool for each of us to use as we consider our role in the controversial issues of our day. The prayer had a number of revisions over time. Below is a commonly used form of the prayer.

"God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, The courage to change the things I can change

And the wisdom to know the difference.

Living one day at time,

Enjoying one moment at a time,

Accepting hardship as a pathway to peace,

Taking, as Jesus did, this sinful world as it is,

Not as I would have it,

Trusting that You will make all things right,

If I surrender to your will,

That I may be reasonably happy in this life,

And supremely happy with You forever in the next.

Amen"
