- 5. I am planning to offer a two-week series on Augustine in early November using the Soup and Study format. Augustine is an important person whom all traditions respect. He lived during a time when the Christianized Roman Empire was being overrun by the tribes from the North. He witnessed the pain of seeing a great civilization destroyed and out of that experience he wrote his well-known City of God, a reimaging of what the Kingdom of Christ is meant to be.


