Our last of three Wednesday's Soup and Study days will be on April 2nd. If you happen to see this newsletter in time and you haven't attended yet, I encourage you to come and join us. We have had a good response with 24 and 29 in attendance the first two sessions.

The preparation for the series on Dietrich Bonhoeffer has given me a more complete understanding of how Hitler came to power in Germany in the 1930's as well as the church's role in his empowerment. Dietrich Bonhoeffer was clearly a prophet who could see what Hitler was doing and how it contradicted the message of Jesus. Unfortunately the majority of the churches in Germany enthusiastically supported Hitler even though they had to be aware of the mistreatment of the Jews.

Obviously there are some unique things about Germany in the 1920 and beyond that made it possible for Hitler to eliminate all opposition and create a dictatorship. But there are a number of things about his rise to power that are common to all 'want-to-be dictators'. In addition to controlling the media, every dictation spreads misinformation which often involves scapegoating a group (or groups) of people.

The irony of it is in Hitler's case, he was not opposed to the church and they regarded him as God's anointed to restore the greatness to Germany. He was remarkably successful in achieving that until he went too far in attacking other countries.

As I mentioned in last month's article, Christians in every country should be aware of just how easy it can be for democracies to fall and for great suffering and injustice to follow.

Looking ahead to the **Easter season**, I encourage you to consider participating in: 1. the intimate setting of the *Maundy Thursday communion service* that begins at 7:00 on 4/17 and 2. The *Easter Sunrise service* at our family farm on 301 Heinsohn Hill Road, Bangor Pa. The service will begin at 6:00 (sunrise is officially set for 6:15). Refreshments will be in the farm house where I was born and raised. 3. Our regular worship service on *Easter Sunday* will be at 10:30.


