At the last two session meetings, we have had some discussions about the future of our church. I shared several goals that I think are important for us to work on and I would like to share these with the whole congregation. In this month's newsletter, let's take a look at one of the most attainable and necessary goals of any vibrant congregation.

Establishing a solid, caring faith community

A solid faith community is more than a collection of individuals who happen to meet on a Sunday morning to hear a sermon and worship God. Anybody can find good sermons and great music to listen to the internet on Sunday mornings or any other time for that matter.

If any small church is to survive long-term, it must work to create a trusting, loving group of people who know each other well enough to share their lives at a deep and personal level. This means that the congregation needs to encourage the bonds of love and affection between the members. There should be enough good will present so that people feel they can share their deepest concerns and burdens with one another and they will know that when confidences are shared, their privacy will be respected and their dignity protected.

Practically, it means that the community gathers regularly for fellowship. It means that the work often associated with the Deacons in their caring ministry is seen as very important. It is a good thing that the Deacons sponsor a coffee hour on the last Sunday of the month. It would be great if that could be expanded to include more Sundays. A good goal would be to have as many as possible, but keep it simple, and to include several luncheons throughout the year. All of us should recognize how important our attendance is, not only in worship but also, anytime the church family gathers.

It also means that members and friends work diligently to avoid disagreements leading to unresolved conflict. Disagreements are unavoidable in any family but there is a loving way to handle them.

Establishing a loving, caring church family is something that is very attainable and very necessary. But it doesn't just happen automatically. I would hope that when visitors come into our gatherings, they would feel welcomed and that they would see 'how we love each other'. There are a number of people 'out there' who are looking for such a fellowship.

Sunday morning Bible study will continue on Sunday, at 9:15 am., studying the gospel of Luke.


The zoom account will also be used so that others who are unable to come to Mt. Bethel can join in. The study will be zoomed each week by Rev. John.

Session will meet on Wednesday, May 14th at 7:00 PM






